### **Ambex Leadership Scholarship**

Scholarships begin at \$500 and are awarded based on merit and financial need.

### **Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship**

2,900 government awards nationwide of up to \$5,000 are available for Pell Grant-eligible students.

### **Good Colleges - Study Abroad Award**

A \$2,000 cash prize that can be used to pay for living expenses while studying abroad.

### **International Institute of Education - Generation Study Abroad Travel Grant**

100 grants nationwide of \$2,000 in the 2017-18 academic year.

### **Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship**

2,900 government awards nationwide of up to \$5,000 are available for Pell Grant-eligible students.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen, an undergraduate student in good standing, receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of study abroad, applying to or accepted into a study abroad program, and planning to study in a country not currently under a Travel Warning issued by the U.S. Department of State.

Scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate academic achievement, whose program of choice connects to his/her future career and personal goals, whose experiences will be used to impact his/her home community, and who possess diversity of background and experiences.

**Critical Language Award:** Applicants who are studying a critical language during their time abroad can apply for a supplemental award of up to \$3,000 that can be combined with the principle scholarship for a combined total of \$8,000. Best Semester Middle East Study Abroad Program (MESP) participants who study Arabic are eligible for this award.

### **Good Colleges - Study Abroad Award**

A \$2,000 cash prize that can be used to pay for living expenses while studying abroad.

To be eligible you must be enrolled or seeking to enroll in an accredited college or university.

Applicants must submit a 150-250 word essay on the theme “Why That City?” Essays should follow the theme, but there are no rules about what style of entry you should submit. The winners will be chosen by a panel and announced within a month of the competition closing.

### **International Institute of Education - Generation Study Abroad Travel Grant**

100 grants nationwide of \$2,000 in the 2017-18 academic year.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, enrolled in an undergraduate degree program, and participating in a study abroad program for academic credit.

Scholarships are awarded according to financial need, academic achievement, appropriateness of the study abroad program for the student’s academic & professional goals, and the long-term impact the award would have on the student and campus.

### **Room to Travel - Study Abroad Scholarship**

The competition winner will be awarded \$1,000.

To be eligible you must be enrolled at an accredited U.S. university and write a 600-800 word essay on what inspires you to travel and what you stand to gain from your study abroad experience. In your essay, include your name, email address, and the university you attend.

### **BrightTax Global Scholar Initiative**

Awards begin at \$1,000 and are based on merit and financial need.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen, currently living in the U.S. and will be studying abroad, and have a minimum GPA of 3.9. Scholarships are only available for full semester programs and are not available for summer programs.

The application process takes into account financial need, academic achievement, community involvement, leadership skills, and achievements in extracurricular activities.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Scholarships are typically awarded in December and July, just before the beginning of Spring and Fall semesters.

## **Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassador Scholarship**

Five awards of \$500 are available each semester.

Award recipients will also receive a “Diversity Abroad Swag Bag,” the opportunity to have their articles, blogs, pictures, and videos promoted by Diversity Abroad, and complimentary registration to the 2017/18 Global Student Leadership Summit.

To be eligible you must meet one of the diversity requirements: African-American/Black, Asian/Pacific Islander, disabilities, first generation, Hispanic/Latino, low-income, multiracial, or Native American. You also must be enrolled as a full-time student or be a recent graduate (1-3 years out, participating in a semester or year-long study, intern, volunteer, or teach abroad program, and have a cumulative 2.75 GPA. Award recipients must also be leaders in their campus and community, energetic, creative, and passionate about international engagement, possess strong writing skills and social media presence, and be committed to challenging stereotypes and promoting positive social change.

Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassadors will represent DiversityAbroad.com for the duration of the program by documenting their experiences with photos and videos on the website, writing an article every two weeks on a topic related your abroad experiences, and share tips and answer questions on the Diversity Abroad Forum.
