ASHLEY SOULÉ CONROY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships are \$4,000 and are awarded based on merit and financial need.

Applicants must demonstrate financial need, include a resume, and write a 500-800 word essay on the following topic: Please tell us about an experience that has changed or shaped your life.

To be eligible you must be enrolled in a study abroad program for at least 1 full semester in the Fall or Spring, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, have completed one year of college-level coursework or 30 credit hours, and be enrolled as an undergraduate student.

BENJAMIN A. GILMAN INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

The U.S. State Department offers 2,900 awards nationwide of up to \$5,000 for study abroad.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen, an undergraduate student in good standing, receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of study abroad, applying to or accepted into a study abroad program, and planning to study in a country not currently under a Travel Warning issued by the U.S. Department of State.

Scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate academic achievement, whose program of choice connects to his/her future career and personal goals, whose experiences will be used to impact his/her home community, and who possess diversity of background and experiences.

CRITICAL NEED LANGUAGE AWARD

Applicants who are receiving a Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship and studying a Critical Need Language during their time abroad can apply for a supplemental award of up to \$3,000 that can be combined with the principle scholarship for a combined total of \$8,000.

BRIGHTTAX GLOBAL SCHOLAR INITIATIVE

Awards begin at \$1,000 and are based on merit and financial need.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen, currently living in the U.S. and will be studying abroad, and have a minimum GPA of 3.9. Scholarships are only available for full semester programs and are not available for summer programs.

The application process takes into account financial need, academic achievement, community involvement, leadership skills, and achievements in extracurricular activities.

Deadlines: Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Scholarships are typically awarded in December and July, just before the beginning of Spring and Fall semesters.

DIVERSITY ABROAD OVERSEAS AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP

Five awards of \$500 are available each semester. Award recipients will also receive a "Diversity Abroad Swag Bag," the opportunity to have their articles, blogs, pictures, and videos promoted by Diversity Abroad, and complimentary registration to the 2017/18 Global Student Leadership Summit.

To be eligible you must meet one of the diversity requirements: African-American/Black, Asian/Pacific Islander, disabilities, first generation, Hispanic/Latino, low-income, multiracial, or Native American. You also must be enrolled as a full-time student or be a recent graduate (1-3 years out, participating in a semester or year-long study, intern, volunteer, or teach abroad program, and have a cumulative 2.75 GPA). Award recipients must also be leaders in their campus and community, energetic, creative, and passionate about international engagement, possess strong writing skills and social media presence, and be committed to challenging stereotypes and promoting positive social change.

Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassadors will represent DiversityAbroad.com for the duration of the program by documenting their experiences with photos and videos on the website, writing an article every two weeks on a topic related your abroad experiences, and share tips and answer questions on the Diversity Abroad Forum.

FUND FOR EDUCATION ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP

An estimated 70 scholarships will be awarded in the 2018-2019 cycle. Awards for semester-long programs are \$5,000. Awards for year-long programs are \$10,000. For summer programs, awards are prorated by length of program (with a minimum of \$1,250).

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, currently enrolled as an undergraduate student, and participating in a study abroad program for at least 4 weeks (28 days).

Preference is given to students who demonstrate financial need and represent a group that is traditionally underrepresented in education abroad (e.g. first-generation college students, minorities, community college students).

GOOD COLLEGES STUDY ABROAD AWARD

Competition winners will receive a \$2,000 cash prize that can be used to pay for living expenses while studying abroad.

To be eligible you must be enrolled or seeking to enroll in an accredited college or university.

Applicants must submit a 150-250 word essay on the theme "Why That City?" Essays should follow the theme, but there are no rules about what style of entry you should submit. The winners will be chosen by a panel and announced within a month of the competition closing.

The Institute of International Education (IIE) will award 100 grants annually, nationwide, of \$2,000.

To be eligible you must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, enrolled in an undergraduate degree program, and participating in a study abroad program for academic credit.

Scholarships are awarded according to financial need, academic achievement, appropriateness of the study abroad program for the student's academic & professional goals, and the long-term impact the award would have on the student and campus.
